# **NUSD TIMELINE**

Senate and Assembly passed AB 117 holding financially harmless school districts. It prevents losses of funding based on ADA, reduced instructional time. changes testing windows, adds flexibility to referral timelines for special education programs, and also offers funding for extra cleaning

SB 98 is signed into law requiring that an individualized education program ("IEP") include a description of how special education and related services, supplementary aids and services. transition services, and extended school year services will be provided under emergency conditions.






