The District

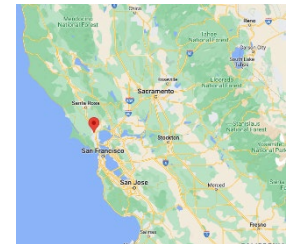
