Dr. Julie Synyard, Executive Director of Education Services, introduced Angela Banuelos of Cooperative Strategies. Ms. Banuelos presented the Lynwood Elementary Sub-Boundary Analysis. Community input was collected through an in-person community meeting, online survey in English and Spanish, project website, and School Locator test maps. Socioeconomic data was also taken into consideration but was not significant in the planning maps. Three proposed maps were presented which included an east/west division, a north/south division, and a division reflecting the majority of current Lynwood Elementary School boundary students who do not attend the Dual Language Immersion program but do attend Rancho Elementary School or Loma Verde Elementary School currently.

#### 16. STAFF REPORT - 7:35 PM

a. (7:35 PM) Beginning of the 2023-24 School Year Data Metrics

Dr. Tracy Smith, Superintendent, presented a plan to share 2023-24 Data Metrics with Trustees throughout the school year. The purpose of the plan is to establish baseline data metrics for measuring the success of District programs and actions to improve student outcomes.

The over 40 metrics in NUSD's Local Control Accountability Plan have been condensed into a manageable list of seven areas of focus for the 2023-24 school year. The proposed data metrics that will be used to establish baseline numbers from the 2022-23 school year include:

- 1. Suspension rate will decrease
- 2. Chronically absent rate will decrease
- 3. Average Daily Attendance will increase from 94% to 95%
- 4. English Learners will accelerate academic learning in order to reclassify
- 5. Increased percentage of students who meet or exceed standards for English Language Arts in each student group
- 6. Increased percentage of students who meet or exceed standards for Math in each student group
- 7. Number of students who earned a D or F in a secondary school course will decrease as measured per semester

Reports and updates to the board will occur quarterly at Regular Board meetings. School site plans will align with this baseline data and individual sites will build their action plans for their own data points.

Dr. Julie Synyard, Executive Director of Education Services, presented the 2023-24 Income Agreement between San Diego County Office of Education and Novato Unified School District Addressing Student Chronic Absenteeism. Based on 2021-22 Dashboard data, student chronic absenteeism was an area of concern for the District. Chronic absenteeism equates to students missing 10% or more school for any reason, both excused and unexcused absences.

The District's target goal is 94% student attendance. In the one month since the initiative has been in place, student attendance has increased to 95.7%.
